Valluvar College of Science and Management, affiliated to Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli ensures effective curriculum delivery through a well-planned and documented process. The curriculum follows the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) designed by the university. The college offers 13 UG programs, 5 PG programs, M.Phil., Ph.D. programs in Commerce and an AICTE-approved MBA program.

The academic calendar outlines classes, exams, holidays, rules, clubs and committees, ensuring smooth organization of curricular, cocurricular and extracurricular activities. Before reopening, faculties' subject preferences are gathered and lesson plans, lab manuals, PowerPoint presentations and E-content are prepared. IQAC conducts regular academic audits to maintain quality.

Activity-based learning is promoted through assignments, role-plays, skits and management games. Add-on, Value Added and Certificate Courses are offered. Faculties use ICT tools and platforms like NDL, N-List and DelNet support research. Practical exposure is ensured

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through Computer Labs (4), Physics Labs (2), FT&CD Labs (2), HMCS Lab (1) and Communication Lab (1). As a Swayam Local Chapter, students gain certifications through SWAYAM/NPTEL and Coursera. Outcome-based education, including projects, surveys and case studies, ensures holistic curriculum delivery.

At our college, we employ various student-centric methods to enhance learning experiences, focusing on experiential learning, participative learning, and problem-solving methodologies.

Experiential learning is a cornerstone of our approach, providing students with opportunities to learn through hands-on experiences. Faculty continuously assess and guide students to help them develop their knowledge, skills, and moral values through real-world applications. Laboratory learning allows students to observe, practice, and experiment with materials, ideas, and phenomena, broadening their practical understanding. Internships, training, and workshops provide students with practical experience by applying theoretical knowledge in real-world settings. Industrial visits, study tours, and field trips offer direct exposure to various industries and environments, enhancing conceptual understanding through experiential learning.

Participative learning involves engaging students in the learning process through activities like group discussions, peer learning, and role play. In our flipped classroom approach, students utilize resources such as Kahoot, Divide and Conquer, Brainly, Jukebox, and Google Classroom to actively engage with the material. Instructors record and post lectures on social media, facilitating a more interactive and student-driven learning environment.

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Problem-solving methodologies are integral to our teaching, improving students' skills, retention, and recall. Methods include surveys, active learning case studies, and projects that enhance critical thinking, aptitude, and reasoning. Faculty use questions to encourage students to think deeply and articulate their queries.

The internal assessment mechanism at Valluvar College of Science and Management is transparent and robust, adhering to the guidelines set by the affiliated Bharathidasan University. The college ensures fair and consistent evaluation through a structured process involving Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Model Examinations. CIA-I and CIA-II are conducted after completing the first two and subsequent two units, respectively, while the Model Examination encompasses the entire syllabus. These examinations are meticulously planned and scheduled after confirming syllabus completion with Heads of Departments and the Principal.

Internal marks are awarded based on a comprehensive evaluation of students' performance in tests, assignments, group activities, and

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seminars. For undergraduate courses, 15 marks are allocated for CIA tests, 5 marks for assignments, and 5 marks for group activities. Postgraduate courses follow a similar distribution, replacing group activities with seminar marks. Attendance is mandatory to qualify for university examinations. Practical assessments are evaluated separately, emphasizing internal performance, record work, and viva voce. This systematic approach ensures the effective delivery of quality education, fostering better academic outcomes.

Role of the Examination Cell

The Examination Cell oversees the smooth conduct of CIA, Model, and University examinations. It prepares schedules, collects question papers in advance, organizes seating arrangements, assigns invigilators, and ensures timely collection and evaluation of answer sheets. Internal marks are recorded in departmental Mark Registers and systematically entered into ERP software.

During University exams, the Principal acts as Chief Superintendent, supported by senior faculty and a five-member Examination Cell. Evaluated scripts must be submitted within two days, with the HoD and Principal rigorously verifying evaluations and mark entries.

Transparency

Exam schedules are published in the college calendar and communicated in advance. Students receive details on syllabus, dates, and durations, with evaluated scripts returned promptly. Marks are submitted within two days, and report cards are shared with parents during Parent-Teacher meetings, ensuring transparency in assessments.

Grievances

Internal grievances, such as mark discrepancies or script corrections, are resolved promptly. External grievances, including

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errors in student details or question paper issues, are addressed through the university with necessary documentation. A dedicated register is maintained for such cases to ensure accountability and resolution.

Valluvar College of Science and Management follows a structured Outcome-Based Education (OBE) approach to evaluate the attainment of Program Outcomes (POS), Program-Specific Outcomes (PSOS) and Course Outcomes (COS). The evaluation ensures alignment between course objectives and program goals, enhancing teaching and learning effectiveness. CO attainment is measured using continuous internal assessments, model exams, assignments, group activities and university-conducted end-semester examinations for theory and practical courses.

The class average mark serves as the benchmark for CO attainment, with results reviewed by department heads and the principal. COs are mapped to POs with specific attainment levels: Level 3 (?90%), Level 2 (?80%), Level 1 (?70%) and Level 0 (<70%). The percentage of students achieving a grade of 85% or higher each semester serves as a key indicator of CO attainment, promoting high achievers and fostering academic excellence.

Valluvar College of Science and Management actively engages in impactful extension activities to address community challenges, emphasizing sustainable development and holistic student growth. Under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Scheme, the college focuses on the needs of adopted villages, fostering meaningful contributions through initiatives led by NSS, YRC, Yi Yuva, and the Rotaract Club.

Key initiatives during 2023-24 included the Green India Mission, where the Eco Club organized four environmental awareness events, involving 1,290 students and 540 residents across Karur district. These efforts promoted eco-friendly practices and environmental conservation. In alignment with Swachh Bharat Yojana, 250 student volunteers conducted cleanliness drives in nearby villages,

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educating 1,500 residents on hygiene and health benefits.

The SVEEP program saw 130 volunteers guiding 300 Malaikovilur residents on voting procedures, while a Blood Donation Drive by the YRC inspired 200 residents to donate blood, saving lives. Additionally, under the Skill India Initiative, 1,200 students participated in skill development programs, gaining valuable knowledge in business, marketing, safety, and legal rights, while also addressing handloom challenges.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching- learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Valluvar College of Science and Management offers a well-equipped infrastructure and extensive physical facilities to foster effective teaching and learning. Situated on a serene 27.67-acre campus along the Karur-Madurai National Highway, the college provides a conducive environment for rural students to pursue academic excellence. The teaching-learning area spans 1,12,907.30 sq. ft., complemented by a hostel facility of 19,000.16 sq. ft. The college accommodates 13 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate, and 2 research programs, housed across four spacious floors.

The institution features 56 ventilated classrooms equipped with fans, tube lights and facilities for ICT-based learning, with 18 classrooms featuring LCD projectors. The classrooms are designed to comfortably seat 50-60 students and are supported by free 100 Mbps Wi-Fi connectivity. Additional facilities include an air-conditioned conference hall, a 600-seater auditorium, and a vast open-air quadrangle for cultural events.

Modern laboratories cater to disciplines like Physics, Hotel Management, Fashion Technology and Computer Science, featuring 348 computers and 65 licensed advanced software packages. The library,

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with a seating capacity of 150, offers 9,840 books, 30 journals and access to digital resources such as N-LIST, NDL, and INFLIBNET. These facilities ensure a dynamic and resourceful academic environment aligned with the college's vision and mission.

In addition to physical activities, the college emphasizes mental well-being with weekly yoga and meditation sessions, guided by the Physical Director. These practices, including Pranayama, help students reduce stress, improve focus and enhance emotional balance.

Supporting overall student welfare, the college also offers a counseling center, sick room, common room, and facilities for differently-abled students. These comprehensive facilities highlight the institution's commitment to fostering a holistic approach to student development, combining physical, mental and emotional health.

The IQAC of the institution continuously reviews and enhances the teaching-learning process, structures, methodologies and learning outcomes. Feedback is collected individually by teachers and directly through IQAC, with students also free to approach the Director for suggestions. Reforms include add-on courses, value-added programs through IECD, Bharathidasan University and collaborations with academic experts like TEDx. Interactive teaching methodologies use platforms such as Kahoot, Quiz Creator, Flipped Classroom and YouTube channels. Online teaching tools like Google

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Meet, Zoom and Jam Board were effectively used during the pandemic. Students also benefit from field trips, internships, industrial visits, mini-projects and experiential learning opportunities.

The institution ensures systematic operations using ROVEN software for record management. MoUs have been signed with IIBF Mumbai, Indian Academic Researchers Association Tiruchirappalli and 28 other institutions. Academic and Administrative Audits and Faculty Self-Appraisal Systems enhance quality, while five villages are adopted under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan scheme.

The institution ensures effective waste management by segregating solid waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories. Biodegradable waste is composted to produce organic manure and vermicompost, while non-biodegradable materials like plastics and glass are collected, sorted, and sent to authorized recyclers. Additionally, fashion technology department ensures that sewing wastes are recycled into beautiful garments, promoting sustainability.

Liquid waste generated on campus is treated using a Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) and reused for irrigation, supporting water conservation and nurturing plants and trees. This eco-friendly approach reduces the dependency on external fertilizers.

Electronic waste, such as outdated computers and accessories, is collected periodically and disposed of through authorized e-waste recyclers. The transition to energy-efficient devices, including the

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replacement of CRT monitors with LCD screens and the use of LED lighting, further contributes to sustainability efforts.

Laboratory chemicals are carefully stored and handled following strict safety protocols, and LPG cylinders are managed with due care. Although radioactive waste is not generated, all hazardous substances are disposed of responsibly to ensure environmental and occupational safety. These practices highlight the institution's commitment to sustainable waste management and environmental responsibility.

In our flipped classroom approach, students utilize resources such as Kahoot, Divide and Conquer, Brainly, Jukebox, and Google Classroom to actively engage with the material. Instructors record and post lectures on social media, facilitating a more interactive and student-driven learning environment.

Problem-solving methodologies are integral to our teaching, improving students' skills, retention, and recall. Methods include surveys, active learning case studies, and projects that enhance critical thinking, aptitude, and reasoning. Faculty use questions to encourage students to think deeply and articulate their queries.

2.5 - Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 - Mechanism of internal assessment is transparent and robust in terms of frequency and mode. Write description within 200 words.

The internal assessment mechanism at Valluvar College of Science and Management is transparent and robust, adhering to the guidelines set by the affiliated Bharathidasan University. The college ensures fair and consistent evaluation through a structured process involving Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA) and Model Examinations. CIA-I and CIA-II are conducted after completing the first two and subsequent two units, respectively, while the Model Examination encompasses the entire syllabus. These examinations are meticulously planned and scheduled after confirming syllabus completion with Heads of Departments and the Principal.

Internal marks are awarded based on a comprehensive evaluation of students' performance in tests, assignments, group activities, and seminars. For undergraduate courses, 15 marks are allocated for CIA tests, 5 marks for assignments, and 5 marks for group

activities. Postgraduate courses follow a similar distribution, replacing group activities with seminar marks. Attendance is mandatory to qualify for university examinations. Practical assessments are evaluated separately, emphasizing internal performance, record work, and viva voce. This systematic approach ensures the effective delivery of quality education, fostering better academic outcomes.

Role of the Examination Cell

The Examination Cell oversees the smooth conduct of CIA, Model, and University examinations. It prepares schedules, collects question papers in advance, organizes seating arrangements, assigns invigilators, and ensures timely collection and evaluation of answer sheets. Internal marks are recorded in departmental Mark Registers and systematically entered into ERP software.

During University exams, the Principal acts as Chief Superintendent, supported by senior faculty and a five-member Examination Cell. Evaluated scripts must be submitted within two days, with the HoD and Principal rigorously verifying evaluations and mark entries.

Transparency

Exam schedules are published in the college calendar and communicated in advance. Students receive details on syllabus, dates, and durations, with evaluated scripts returned promptly. Marks are submitted within two days, and report cards are shared with parents during Parent-Teacher meetings, ensuring transparency in assessments.

Grievances

Internal grievances, such as mark discrepancies or script

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corrections, are resolved promptly. External grievances, including errors in student details or question paper issues, are addressed through the university with necessary documentation. A dedicated register is maintained for such cases to ensure accountability and resolution.

Valluvar College of Science and Management follows a structured Outcome-Based Education (OBE) approach to evaluate the attainment of Program Outcomes (POS), Program-Specific Outcomes (PSOS) and Course Outcomes (COS). The evaluation ensures alignment between course objectives and program goals, enhancing teaching and learning effectiveness. CO attainment is measured using continuous internal assessments, model exams, assignments, group activities and university-conducted end-semester examinations for theory and practical courses.

The class average mark serves as the benchmark for CO attainment, with results reviewed by department heads and the principal. COs are mapped to POs with specific attainment levels: Level 3 (?90%), Level 2 (?80%), Level 1 (?70%) and Level 0 (<70%). The percentage of students achieving a grade of 85% or higher each semester serves as a key indicator of CO attainment, promoting high achievers and fostering academic excellence.

Program Outcomes are evaluated comprehensively through cumulative grades, exams, assignments, and projects, offering a holistic view of students' knowledge, skills and competencies. This robust evaluation process ensures the effective measurement of academic success and continuous improvement in achieving program goals.

Valluvar College of Science and Management actively engages in

impactful extension activities to address community challenges, emphasizing sustainable development and holistic student growth. Under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan Scheme, the college focuses on the needs of adopted villages, fostering meaningful contributions through initiatives led by NSS, YRC, Yi Yuva, and the Rotaract Club.

Key initiatives during 2023-24 included the Green India Mission, where the Eco Club organized four environmental awareness events, involving 1,290 students and 540 residents across Karur district. These efforts promoted eco-friendly practices and environmental conservation. In alignment with Swachh Bharat Yojana, 250 student volunteers conducted cleanliness drives in nearby villages, educating 1,500 residents on hygiene and health benefits.

The SVEEP program saw 130 volunteers guiding 300 Malaikovilur residents on voting procedures, while a Blood Donation Drive by the YRC inspired 200 residents to donate blood, saving lives. Additionally, under the Skill India Initiative, 1,200 students participated in skill development programs, gaining valuable knowledge in business, marketing, safety, and legal rights, while also addressing handloom challenges.

These activities underscore the college's commitment to community welfare, sensitizing students to social issues and instilling a sense of social responsibility for their holistic development.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Valluvar College of Science and Management offers a well-equipped infrastructure and extensive physical facilities to foster effective teaching and learning. Situated on a serene 27.67-acre

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campus along the Karur-Madurai National Highway, the college provides a conducive environment for rural students to pursue academic excellence. The teaching-learning area spans 1,12,907.30 sq. ft., complemented by a hostel facility of 19,000.16 sq. ft. The college accommodates 13 undergraduate, 5 postgraduate, and 2 research programs, housed across four spacious floors.

The institution features 56 ventilated classrooms equipped with fans, tube lights and facilities for ICT-based learning, with 18 classrooms featuring LCD projectors. The classrooms are designed to comfortably seat 50-60 students and are supported by free 100 Mbps Wi-Fi connectivity. Additional facilities include an airconditioned conference hall, a 600-seater auditorium, and a vast open-air quadrangle for cultural events.

Modern laboratories cater to disciplines like Physics, Hotel Management, Fashion Technology and Computer Science, featuring 348 computers and 65 licensed advanced software packages. The library, with a seating capacity of 150, offers 9,840 books, 30 journals and access to digital resources such as N-LIST, NDL, and INFLIBNET. These facilities ensure a dynamic and resourceful academic environment aligned with the college's vision and mission.

Indoor games such as carom, chess and other cognitive sports help in mental development.

The college's Physical Director plays a key role in preparing

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students for state and national-level competitions, with students securing medals in athletics, volleyball, kabaddi, badminton and more. Regular training ensures both physical fitness and the development of resilience, sportsmanship and discipline.

In addition to physical activities, the college emphasizes mental well-being with weekly yoga and meditation sessions, guided by the Physical Director. These practices, including Pranayama, help students reduce stress, improve focus and enhance emotional balance.

Supporting overall student welfare, the college also offers a counseling center, sick room, common room, and facilities for differently-abled students. These comprehensive facilities highlight the institution's commitment to fostering a holistic approach to student development, combining physical, mental and emotional health.

6.5.2 - The institution reviews its teaching learning process, structures & methodologies of operations and learning outcomes at periodic intervals through IQAC set up as per norms and recorded the incremental improvement in various activities

The IQAC of the institution continuously reviews and enhances the teaching-learning process, structures, methodologies and learning outcomes. Feedback is collected individually by teachers and directly through IQAC, with students also free to approach the Director for suggestions. Reforms include add-on courses, value-added programs through IECD, Bharathidasan University and collaborations with academic experts like TEDx. Interactive teaching methodologies use platforms such as Kahoot, Quiz Creator, Flipped Classroom and YouTube channels. Online teaching tools like Google Meet, Zoom and Jam Board were effectively used during the pandemic. Students also benefit from field trips, internships, industrial visits, mini-projects and experiential learning opportunities.

The institution ensures systematic operations using ROVEN software for record management. MoUs have been signed with IIBF Mumbai, Indian Academic Researchers Association Tiruchirappalli and 28 other institutions. Academic and Administrative Audits and Faculty Self-Appraisal Systems enhance quality, while five villages are adopted under the Unnat Bharat Abhiyan scheme.

Student performance is closely monitored through internal tests, assignments and attendance tracking, with remedial classes for weaker students. Incremental improvements include free bus services for rural students, alumni interactions and awards in academic, cultural and sporting events. Result analysis ensures timely corrective action, highlighting the institution's commitment to continuous progress and quality enhancement.

Counseling: Emotional well-being of female students is supported by class mentors who address stress and anxiety. Professional counselors offer additional support when necessary. Day Care Center: The College provides a day care center for staff with young children, promoting a family-friendly environment.

Hazardous chemicals and radioactive waste management

The institution ensures effective waste management by segregating solid waste into biodegradable and non-biodegradable categories. Biodegradable waste is composted to produce organic manure and vermicompost, while non-biodegradable materials like plastics and glass are collected, sorted, and sent to authorized recyclers. Additionally, fashion technology department ensures that sewing wastes are recycled into beautiful garments, promoting sustainability.

Liquid waste generated on campus is treated using a Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) and reused for irrigation, supporting water conservation and nurturing plants and trees. This eco-friendly approach reduces the dependency on external fertilizers.

Electronic waste, such as outdated computers and accessories, is collected periodically and disposed of through authorized e-waste recyclers. The transition to energy-efficient devices, including the replacement of CRT monitors with LCD screens and the use of LED lighting, further contributes to sustainability efforts.

Laboratory chemicals are carefully stored and handled following strict safety protocols, and LPG cylinders are managed with due care. Although radioactive waste is not generated, all hazardous substances are disposed of responsibly to ensure environmental and occupational safety. These practices highlight the institution's commitment to sustainable waste management and environmental responsibility.
